August 8—13, 2009

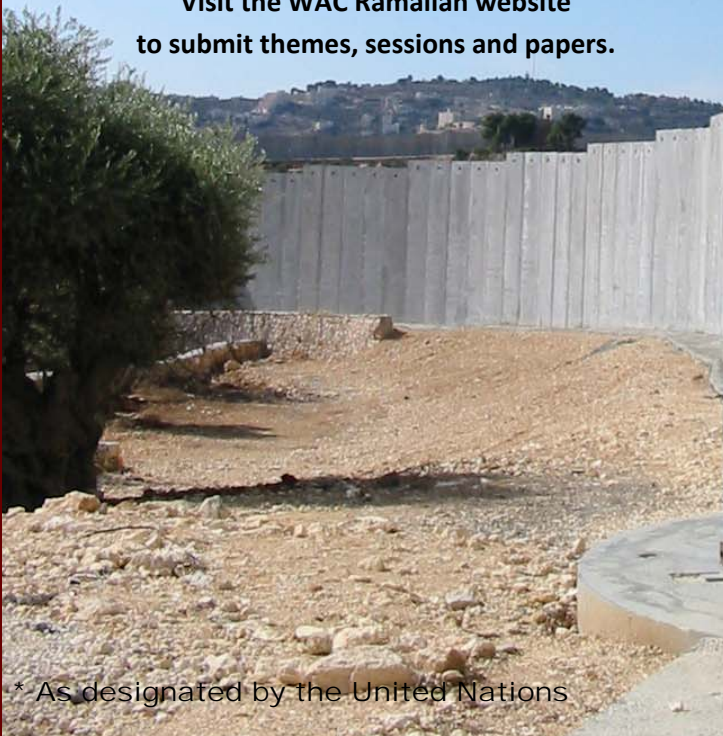
The theme of this InterCongress is structural violence—the stark inequality inherent in the West’s relations with nearly all non-Western countries.
